### ODCC Community Veteran Celebration (07 October)

The first annual Community Veteran Celebration was held at the Capon Valley Bank in Stephens City on October 7. The event was the brainchild of Melba Thorne, the bank manager. The event planning committee was comprised of Melba, along with Mariah Smith, (Army veteran and city councilwoman), Christine Cregar

(owner of Pawsitively Heaven), and ODCC member Al (Navy veteran and business owner). A smaller-than-hoped-for number of cars showed up as a result of rain that continued into late morning and competition from other car events taking place that day. However, once the rain stopped, the rest of the day was beautifully sunny. ODCC was represented by Dennis, Laurie, and Al, and some local Corvette owners came, as well as a couple of classic cars and a motorcycle group of Veterans.

Everyone gathered at about 1300 to recite the pledge of allegiance, followed by a playing of the national anthem. Next, all Veterans in attendance were recognized by their respective service branch, and Veterans who had passed were honored with a moment of silence. VFW Post 2123 then gave a gun salute and played taps.

There were a number of booths from various small businesses and Veteran-oriented services, including Healing Waters, that sets up sessions to teach Wounded Warriors and Veterans how to tie fishing lures and provides fly fishing opportunities, Honor Flight Top of Virginia, a local Virginia branch of Honor Flights that busses local Veterans to the Memorials in Washington, D.C. ([www.HonorFlight-TOV.org](http://www.HonorFlight-TOV.org) for anyone interested in helping), the VFW, and others.

Attendees were able to participate in several raffles, buy homemade bake sale goodies with the proceeds going to help a local AMVET's volunteer in need, enjoy some free pizza and hotdogs, and also enjoy additional selections from the on-site food truck.




## Summit Point Motorsports Park Cruise-In Car Show (8 October)

Approximately 50 members, family members, and guests attended. We started the evening by holding our last 2023 member meeting before indulging in the most important activity – the competitive chili and cornbread judging. Besides the seven chili entries and six cornbread entries, several members brought wonderful cakes, pies, and cookies. Gary provided a variety of other food just to add some variety and ensure everyone had enough to eat. Gary also hired Masters of Mixology, who supplied three professional bartenders to handle all the beverages and entertained people around the basement bar area. To entertain the kids, Gary played a Christmas movie in his home theater room.



Everyone was invited to taste all the chili and cornbread entries then vote on their top three choices. Each of us received two sets of three poker chips, one set (green, red, and white chips) for chili and the other for cornbread. Green chips were worth 100 points, red chips were worth 50 points, and the white ones were worth 25. Each competitive entry had a dedicated, labeled mason jar with a slotted top set up on Gary's dining room credenza. After tasting the entries, judges dropped a green chip into the jar with a label matching their first choice of chili, red chip into the jar matching their second chili choice, and green chip into the jar matching their third chili choice. The judges used the same procedure to vote for the cornbread choices. Once everyone had finished sampling and voting, we counted the different colored chips, applied the points, tallied up the totals, and then announced the winners. # National Corvette Museum

## Ambassador Tidbits

There has been a lot going on at the National Corvette Museum recently. The Anniversary Celebration is held on Labor Day Weekend every year to celebrate the Grand Opening of the Museum in 1994. Participants enjoy two full days of activities around the Museum, including access to special presentations by Corvette senior executives, seminars, displays, raffles and the Corvette Hall of Fame Induction.

The Corvette Hall of Fame was established by the National Corvette Museum in 1998 to confer official recognition upon the most influential individuals in the history of the Corvette and honor their achievements. Corvette Hall of Fame inductees have distinguished themselves, not only through their accomplishments, but also by their high standards of integrity and character that reflect and enhance the reputation of the Corvette. Each year, a leader is inducted into the Corvette Hall of Fame from one of three categories:

- Enthusiast
- Racing
- GM / Chevrolet

The 2023 inductees are:

- John Amgwert – Enthusiasts
- Dan Binks – Racing
- David Wickman – GM / Chevrolet.

Lifetime Members, Winner's Circle, Spire Society, and Duntov Society members receive an invitation to this event annually (Lifetime Members are free; other members are \$85; and all other guests are \$90).

Why is this important to you? Well, there are several reasons:

1. 2024 will be the 30<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of the Grand Opening of the Museum. ODCC Board member Bob has volunteered to be the leader of the Virginia Caravan to this event. He has been busy drumming up interest across ODCC. Bob will be sharing information on the Caravan events throughout the year, including side trips like breakfast at the Biltmore, and sightseeing at both regional interest and Corvette sites along the way.
2. You will be able to meet, up close and personal, movers and shakers in the Corvette world. You will be able to hear facts about Corvettes current and future from the people who know the facts (not just someone writing a blog)! And when you hear Tadge Juechter, the Executive Chief Engineer for Corvette, say that something cannot be discussed, you will know that no one except GM insiders knows the answer!
3. If you are a Lifetime Member of the Museum, many of the special events during the Anniversary celebration will be free or reduced cost. If you have any questions about Museum membership and its benefits, please reach out to me.

## All Roads Lead to Bowling Green!

2024 marks the 30th anniversary of the Nation Corvette Museum! To celebrate, the Museum is hosting the Seventh National Corvette Caravan from 29-31 August 2024. Held every fifth-year anniversary, the Caravan is the world's largest moving automotive rally. Regional caravans from all over the U.S. and Canada will meet up with other regional groups as they converge on Bowling Green, KY, for three days of festivities. There will be presentations by members of GM's Corvette team, Corvette Master Technicians and vendors, vendor displays and sales, prize giveaways, food trucks galore, and more. Live entertainment is expected (Jefferson Starship performed in 2019). It's a great opportunity to meet up with 7 or 8,000 of your closest Corvette friends, learn about the cars, directly ask questions of the Corvette team, and just generally have a good time.



ODCC's own Bob M. is the state leader for the Virginia state Caravan, which will meet up with groups from Maryland and North and South Carolina. ODCC and other Northern Virginia owners will leave on Monday, 26 August, joining in with the Maryland group and picking up other Virginia owners on the way to Asheville, where we'll meet up with the Carolina groups and begin the Caravan to Bowling Green. Separate registrations are required for the regional caravan and for the NCM activities. Hotel rooms in Bowling Green are going fast, and our block of rooms in Asheville is full (but there is another hotel right next door, and one across the street). Finally, planning and organizing an event of this magnitude takes a considerable amount of time, effort, and expense. Each regional caravan is responsible for raising money to support its activities, which include subsidizing hotel rates. We do this primarily by selling advertisements in our Caravan route book, which is given to each registered participant. We encourage individuals to take out a credit card size ad (\$50). Many participants choose to display a photo of their vanity plate (\$25). ## NCM suspending Assembly Plant Tours Indefinitely beginning in February

If you haven't ever been on a Corvette Assembly Plant tour, you are missing something great. They are normally provided free to all who get the R8C option (Museum delivery), and are available for \$50 to others (though NCM members get a discount). The tours run an hour and a half to two hours, and takes you through most of the plant, giving you an up close and personal look at how these great cars are put together (see the article in the Winter 2022 Newsletter for more details). Unfortunately, the NCM recently



announced that it will be suspending tours of the Assembly Plant beginning in February, with no time limit specified. The announcement said: “Due to manufacturing advancements, tours offered by the National Corvette Museum of GM’s Bowling Green Assembly Plant will be suspended beginning Monday, 05 February 2024. At this time, there is no confirmed date for plant tour resumption.” (The last time they suspended tours it took five years for the tours to resume.) No other details were provided, but there has been speculation about the new ZR1 and whether they might be doing some pilot builds, or that they are making model changes for the 2025 model year. If you want to get in a tour before they shut down, Friday 02 February 2024 is your last chance! To reserve your spot now, visit [Schedule a Plant Tour](#).

- **25 – 27 April 2024: 27<sup>th</sup> Annual Michelin NCM Bash.** This event will include seminars by Michelin, Mobil 1, General Motors, Bowling Green Assembly Plant, and classroom sessions by GM certified Corvette Technician Paul Koerner. Enjoy guided road tours, NCM Choice car show, a live auction, vendors, and the announcement of the 2024 Corvette Hall of Fame Class.
- **29 – 31 August 2024: 30th Anniversary / Caravan.** In 2024, the NCM marks the 30th Anniversary milestone. This event will focus on the people Corvette has brought together and take a look back on the Museum’s history and forward to the future! Registered participants can enjoy three days of activities in and around the Museum, special presentations, raffles, and more! Events will include the 2024 Corvette Hall of Fame Induction ceremony, Motorsports Park activities, wine and bourbon tastings, seminars / presentations, special displays and exhibits, classroom sessions with Corvette expert Paul Loerner, Corvette product demonstrations, demonstration drives and walk-arounds, Friday night banquet, Saturday night concert, and more. Event pre-registration (\$50 for Lifetime Members; \$60 for members; \$85 for non-members) closes on Monday, 05 August at 12 pm CDT, though Caravan registration will close on 08 July at 12 pm CDT. Much like 2019, this event will use shuttle buses to transport participants around the campus and parking lots. Parking, including ADA parking spaces, will be available at the NCM and the NCM Motorsports Park.



## Update from the Vice President

Warmest holiday greetings to all. I think 2023 has been very successful for the Club, both in membership growth and in the level and variety of events available. Sincere kudos to Bob for the super work in identifying, organizing, and executing Club activities as the Events Coordinator. Similar kudos are in order for the member support in leading and participating in both the local and long-distance opportunities. We continued our Weekday Wanderer concept this year focused on retirees and those with the flexibility to participate in weekday events and I think it has been a resounding success. Last year, the Front Royal Vibrissa Beer & Kitchen restaurant was our first Weekday Wanderer event. In November, we went full circle with a delightful drive to Front Royal and repeat lunch there, with even more participants this year.

I want to recognize one of the Club's premier community outreach activities in its second year and offer a hearty well done to John for spear heading the Corvettes for LAWs Christmas event. Club members contributed nearly \$1500 in cash and material donations to provide coats, jackets, boots, toys, and other gift items to families supported by the [LAWS Domestic Violence & Sexual Assault Services Center](#).

As Membership Coordinator, I can report that we continue to grow as a Club, adding nearly 50 new members, including spouses, in 2023. I think it's important to include husbands and wives in that count since both are integral to the welcoming spirit that has made ODCC so successful.

One of the things the Board is doing for 2024 includes some major changes to our annual Cruise-In. Gary Kyle did a survey after the Cruise-In this past year and got a lot of good inputs (122 recommendations to be exact!). We have reviewed all of them and are implementing many of them. Probably the biggest change is when we hold the Cruise-In. We heard our members loud and clear noting that August is simply too hot. Neither participants nor volunteers enjoyed baking in the August sun, so we are working with Bomnin Chevrolet to identify a date later in the fall when temperatures are more moderate, and when we won't be competing with other Corvette events. We are also considering adding award categories and trophies for exhibitors. Gary is leading an effort to revamp our planning process to make it smoother and provide all our volunteers with a clear understanding of what each role entails, and we are also planning to better organize all our supplies to make set-up and take-down easier for everyone.

We will be going back to Tuscarora Mills Restaurant for our Winter Banquet in February. Last year's event got great reviews from those who attended. We were, and are size-limited to 50 participants. We had 47 last year so it appears we were pretty close in estimating turn out.

## Treasurer's Report

As the year 2023 winds down, it is appropriate to summarize our financial picture for the Old Dominion Corvette Club. This report focuses on what expenses ODCC incurred, as well as income. This report doesn't address the Cruise-In or other events which are accounted for separately.

As of 30 November 2023, the Club has a balance of \$3,469.55 in our two accounts (Wells Fargo and PayPal). Included in that amount is \$395 which is allocated to cash donations for the Loudoun Abused Women's Shelter (LAWS) Christmas giving event (note: this total increased to \$1295 in December). The major source of income for the Club is dues. So far this year, \$1100 in dues have been collected year to date from both new and continuing members. The remainder of the current membership, which is the majority, pays dues in December.

Our fixed expenses run over \$2600 a year. Major expenditures this year include the renewal of our liability insurance with Hagerty for \$350. Continuing expenses for our ClubExpress service run about \$700 a year, with payments made monthly. URL registration is \$177 a year. Our storage shed is \$720 a year, and the postal box, which is required by the SCC, runs \$430 a year. State Corporation Commission (SCC) registration costs \$25 a year.

Other expenses include postage and member name tags that have run over \$450 year. PayPal fees so far this year have exceeded \$320 and miscellaneous expenses (i.e., flowers and various fees) have exceeded \$560. In all expenses run over \$3200 a year to support the day-to-day operation of the Club. For readability, I've rounded the expenses. However, all the supporting details are available on request.
